

Attainment and Progress: *A Commentary for Parents*

National Curriculum Levels measure your child's progress in each subject. The table below shows the rate of progress for a child achieving in line with national expectations.

Not all children progress at the same rate and therefore this is seen as a **guide** for parents and teachers in tracking each child's progress.

The National Average at the end of the year 6 is Secure Level 4 (4b)
